We are sad to report the passing of Colin Powell

Colin Powell MBE

Colin was an active member of the British Polio Fellowship and as Patron, raised awareness of Polio and Post-Polio Syndrome throughout the country.

In fact, he received an MBE in the 2022 New Year Honours list for his services to people with polio in the UK.



Born Stewart Colin Powell, Colin was just 73 when he died on Tuesday 3rd January. He will be greatly missed by the team, but even more by our very own Dawn Grafetsberger, as Dawn and Colin had become engaged late last year.

Colin worked tirelessly with Rotary to support the eradication of polio and with the Fellowship to raise awareness and generate funds for the charity. Last year he raised over £3,000 to go towards the Fellowship's Heating Grant Fund which supports members on low incomes.
